




2017 held community building, research, conference presentations, trainings, groups, structured and drop in coaching, and more. Here is a glimpse of our year.



Research

"The mindfulness research study provided a safe and supportive framework for me to begin connecting with my body on a more honest level and confront how I related to it. I have has a few crises hit since the study and continually draw upon exercises and meditations I learned while in the study. The work Upswing Advocates is doing has the potential to provide necessary support, resources, and tools to other trans folx in need. What I took away from the experience was truly life changing. I can't wait for these resources to become more accessible to the trans community on a broader level."





Coaching

"I used to think coaching was a gimmicky thing. I now feel, however, that there are many micro managable events that are difficult to coordinate in the bigger scheme of things. Coaching helped me get more organized and to stay on top of things through different tools that I don't normally use."



Trainings

"I feel more responsible now, like there is more I can actually do to be affirming with regard to overt behaviors, not just passively hold the value to affirm."



2017 COACHING CLIENT DEMOGRAPHICS







ORIENTATION




ANNUAL INCOME






BEHAVIORS TARGETED






2017 FISCAL YEAR REVENUE

PRESENTATION PARTNERSHIPS

For the 2017 Cultural Impact Conference, we partnered with Broadway Youth Center to present Serving TGNC Young Adults: Community Based Approaches to Restorative Justice and Harm Reduction. Broadway Youth Center is a division of Howard Brown Health that serves LGBTQ youth and young people experiencing homelessness or housing instability. This year we also partnered with the Chicago Metropolitan Battered Women's Network to present on Domestic Violence in LGBTQ Relationships as a part of their 40-hour Domestic Violence Training.

RETREATS

In 2017, we partnered with Chicago Neurodiverse Queers to facilitate their retreat: Sharing Our Identities Safely and Authentically. Chicago Neurodiverse Queers is a monthly meetup group for all who fall under the neurodiversity umbrella and who also identify as queer. We also partnered with ResonaTe to facilitate their mindfulness retreat. ResonaTe is a Chicago choir for transgender voices and community.

FACILITATION

This year we partnered with Peter Frotch to facilitate a day of helping professionals collaborating on alternatives to calling the police on clients in a professional setting. We also facilitated a space for identifying values and setting goals at the 2nd annual Trans Turning Point at Center on Halsted.

GROUPS

For Us: Queer Affirming Psychoeducation, was an overarching series partnership with board member Jason Best, LCSW, that covered Mental Health Foundations, Cognitive Distortions, Boundaries and Interpersonal Skills, Dealing with Holiday Stress, and Creating Goals for the New Year.

RESEARCH

This year we concluded sessions with our 20th and final Mindfulness Study participant as a part of our research partnership with The Chicago School of Professional Psychology.

VALUES

Self-determination: We believe that all people deserve respect, and the freedom to make their own choices and focus on what is most valuable to them. Each person has the right to define their gender, sexuality, and other identities in whatever ways they choose.

Non-hierarchical work: Rather than a more traditional model of "experts" shaping research and trainings, our focus is on creating collaborative relationships with emphasis on shared experiences and strengths.

Workability: We strive to do what makes practical sense. If a strategy stops working, or doesn't work in a particular context, we seek out new options to determine what works best in a given situation and continue to evaluate progress over time.

Empowering the LGBTQIA community: We seek out direct involvement and feedback from LGBTQIA individuals in our organization's activities and leadership so the research we conduct and the education we provide is by us, for us. In addition, no one will be turned away from educational services because of an inability to pay.

VISION

We envision **freely available and affordable** treatments and services that are tailored to the LGBTQIA community that are empirically supported by data-based, community-informed research.

The generous support of our 2017 donors allowed us to continue offering sliding scale coaching and groups for LGBTQIA people, to conduct TGNC affirming research, and to offer affirming trainings for helping professionals. Thank you for being a vital part of this important work.

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
